TOP TEN PLACINGS FOR SHERRIN MOTORSPORT AT HIDDEN VALLEY

Two of Sherrin Motorsport's three entries recorded top ten finishes in round three of the Carrera Cup Championship at Darwin's Hidden Valley raceway, including fourth overall for the Juniper-sponsored Porsche driven by Ian Dyk.

The weekend's racing in the 'Top End' tested both drivers and crew as temperatures soared to 44 degrees Celsius on the track.

20 year-old Dyk, the youngest driver in the championship, kept his cool and repeated his success from the previous round of the championship to again finish fourth for the round.

The Juniper driver made exceptional starts in the first two races and maintained a consistently strong performance across all three events to finish 6th, 4th and 5th respectively.

Carrera Cup rookie David Russell made his debut at the Hidden Valley circuit and kept the Boom Logistics/Sherrin Hire Porsche on race pace, despite having difficulties preserving tyre rubber in the extremely hot conditions.

The 24 year-old's best result was 8th in race one, followed by 10th and 11th place in the following two races.

Sherrin Motorsport-sponsored Daniel Pappas continues to make inroads in the national all-Porsche series as he makes the transition from racing open wheelers to hard tops.

The 24 year-old showed he's adapting to the category, by finding good race speed on debut in Darwin and was unlucky when the Porsche didn't forgive an attempted passing move under brakes at 240 kilometres an hour. Prior to spinning out, Pappas had made up five places in the first four laps of race two. 18th place was his best achievement.

The Sherrin Motorsport team heads to Sydney's Oran Park for round four in August, with drivers Ian Dyk positioned 5th, David Russell 8th and Daniel Pappas 21st in the championship.
