

JUNIPER CUT SHORT IN RACE TWO

#11 Juniper Racing driver Shaun Juniper had his race two assault cut short after being side swiped on the first lap at Indy on the Gold Coast.

Although the contact made to Juniper's car did not prevent him from finishing the race, it did force him to the pits twice in the same number of laps after damage to his left front and rear tyre.

"I was really confident heading into the race, but I guess you just have to put it down to a racing incident and there is not a lot you can do about those," said Shaun Juniper.

Juniper was starting race two from a personal best position of 12th on the grid, but with two pit stops in two laps, his chances of beating his race one result were limited.

"The car felt really solid after race one and I know that I could have made up some positions from my starting position in the race," said Juniper.

"That result won't knock my confidence though, I know the car is good enough and that I can get ahead of the guys in front of me," added Juniper.

Juniper Racing, Team Manager, Alistair Bye was disappointed after such a good race one for Juniper.

"These racing incidents can't be prevented sometimes, but I was really confident that Shaun (Juniper) would do even better in the race today," said Alistair Bye.

"He (Shaun Juniper) really enjoys this track and it shows, he is very fast around the track and is really competitive," added Bye.

The year's final Carrera Cup race will take place on Sunday morning at 8:25am.
